

We choppered into Assiniboine. Way cool & less expensive than you might think. (about C\$150)




Each night we imbibed our generous allotment of alcohol; each day we planned a different challenging day hike. We want to get high as quickly as possible; way above the treeline.

Mt. Robson — the highest of the Canadian Rockies — dominates the surroundings even more than does Assiniboine. Berg Lake at the base of the mountain is awesome with a glacier spilling directly into the water.

No major problems on this trip, aside from the nightly porcupine attack.

Another highlight on Robson was Snowbird pass, a magical alpine meadow far above the glacier. We encountered 3 white-blonde Dutch children playing there, shirtless & shoeless. Somehow, they fit right in.
